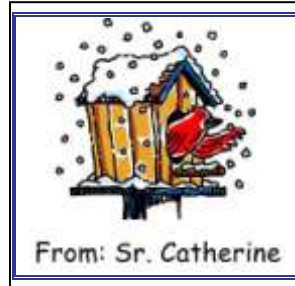
### ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

**Loaves and Fishes:**  
We will be preparing and serving CHILI on Monday, February 6<sup>th</sup> at Christ Church

Cathedral. Please follow this recipe:

## CHILI

This will serve 4 people. For the Soup Kitchen, please triple it so it will serve 10 to 12.

- ¾ lbs of hamburger
- 1 cup chopped onions
- ½ cup green peppers chopped
- 2 cloves of garlic (minced)
- 1 (16 ounce can) of red kidney beans (drained)
- 18 ounce can of tomato sauce
- 2 teaspoons of chili powder
- ½ teaspoon of dried basil
- ¼ teaspoon of salt and pepper.

Cook hamburger, onions, garlic and green peppers together until meat is cooked – drain fat. Add the rest of the ingredients, kidney beans, tomato sauce, chili powder, dried basil, salt and pepper. Simmer for 20 minutes.

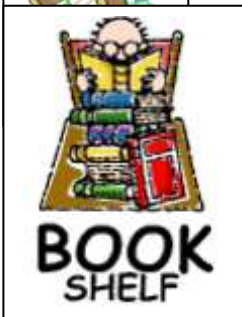

The Bookshelf has a number of patrons who generously share their beloved books with others. Msgr. David Joyce donated a large number of fine books. We are especially pleased to have acquired some Spanish language books thanks to his generosity. Our Spanish language books are located separately in the Bible and Church section in the first stack on the left.

Recently Rose Talbot Babey shared some books from her collection with The Bookshelf. These treasured books include Everyday Epiphanies, Seeing the Sacred in Every Thing, by Melannie Svoboda, SND. This book on Spirituality is so appropriate for "Ordinary Time," which the Church is now observing. It is organized by the seasons of nature. She asks on page 113 "Will I be inspired today? Will the magic happen again? The magic, of course, is the ability to fashion something that transcends our personal limitations." The book is interspersed with scriptural quotations and the author's reflections. We have also acquired The Liturgical Year, the spiraling adventure of the spiritual life, by prolific author Joan Chittister, OSB. "The liturgical year is an adventure in bringing the Christian life to fullness, the heart to alert, the soul to focus," says the author. Joan Chittister is a Benedictine nun and international lecturer. She finds the richness in Ordinary Time and Sundays as well as in the Church's Holy Days and the Seasons of Advent and Lent .

Also donated is a pristine copy of The Fathers by Pope Benedict XVI. This 2008 book is a study of the Apostolic Fathers of the Church from St. Clement, Bishop of Rome to St. Augustine of Hippo. The book can be found in the Bible and Church stack with other books by and about the Popes.

We are so blessed to have generous donors who are willing to share their collections in our informal communal library. The honor system is just that. The Bookshelf operates on trust and respect. Thank you for continuing the cycle of generous sharing by returning your books to the return basket on our shelves in a timely way.
