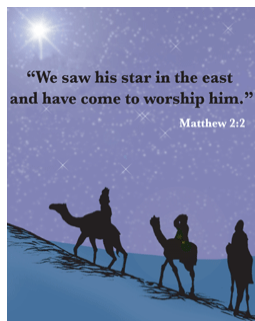

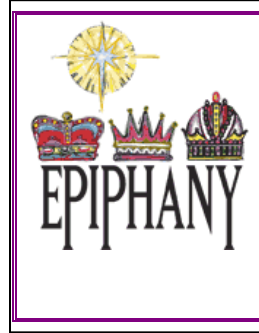


Food Pantry

Bingo is held on Wednesday evenings from 6:50 until 9:30.

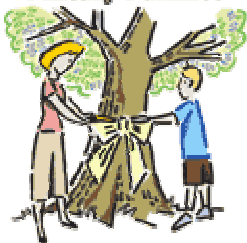
