The Holy Name Gift Shop will be open next Saturday following the 4:30 Mass and after all morning Masses on Sunday. Just a

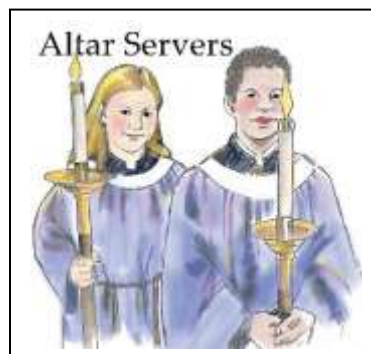
reminder: Holy Name Christmas Cards are available at the Gift Shop.

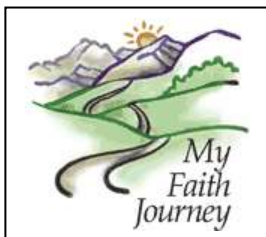

Every day we are seeing more and more heartbreaking news about the drought and famines in Somalia and the eastern parts of Africa. We see millions of people being forced from their homes, parents whose children have died, and children who have been orphaned. They are suffering from hunger, thirst, disease and drought.
